### Medication Information For Your Injection

1. Please be sure to **STOP** the following Anti-Inflammatory Medications **5 days prior** to your scheduled injection:

-Aleve	-Duracet	-Naprosyn
-Advil	-Feldene	-Plaquenil
-Aspirin (325mg)	-Ibuprofen	-Pletal
-Baclofen	-Indocin	-Relafen
-Bufferin	-Lodine	-Ultracet
-Cataflam	-Mobic	-Voltaren
-Daypro	-Motrin	

2. You **may** take the following medications prior to your injection, *they are ok*:

-Aspirin (81 mg ONLY)	-Percocet	-Tylenol or any of its derivates
-Celebrex	-Skelaxin	-Valium
-Flexeril	-Soma	-Vicodin
-Lyrica	-Tramadol/Ultram	-Zanaflex
-Neurontin		

3. **Coumadin** must be stopped five (5) days prior to the procedure and **Plavix** must be stopped seven (7) days prior to the procedure—you **must not stop these medications without clearance from your primary care physician**. You must contact your physician for continuation of these medications.

4. **Glucophage/Metformin** must be stopped the day before your injection, the day of your injection and one day after your injection- **please contact your Primary Care Physician regarding the stopping of this medication.**
